- Each of the Neutral panels is represented by a member of the Selection and Coaching Committee
- Each of the other panels has the most appropriate representative based on location or type of panel.

The role of the representative is to act as a point of contact and support for the umpires within their panels. Their role includes but is not limited to:

- Contacting the umpires on their panel to inform them of opportunities that are available to them
- Receiving contact from umpires on their panel and passing information to the SCC where appropriate [NB this can include acting for umpires who wish to remain anonymous]
- Advising umpires on their panel on umpiring matters
- Being available to umpires on their panel who may wish to talk to them following a particularly difficult match – or a particularly good match
- Discussing the aspirations of umpires on their panel

Umpires are encouraged to make use of their panel representative as a key point of contact.
